Message Title: Three Questions to Ask Yourself This Summer

Mark 1:35-39 - Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed.³⁶ Simon and his companions went to look for him,³⁷ and when they found him, they exclaimed: "Everyone is looking for you!"³⁸ Jesus replied, "Let us go somewhere else--to the nearby villages--so I can preach there also. That is why I have come."³⁹ So he traveled throughout Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons.

Questions for Reflection and Discussion

6. Of course that intentionality came from His heavenly Father, which Jesus had a firm grasp on. What actions can you take to ensure the same in your life?
7. It would be best if you set aside some time in solitude and prayer to consider the following three questions. But if you were to answer these questions right now, what would your answers be?
 - A. Lord, what do you want me to STOP doing?
 - B. Lord, what do you want me to KEEP doing?
 - C. Lord, what do you want me to START doing?
