
³ But Jonah ran away from the Lord and headed for Tarshish. He went down to Joppa, where he found a ship bound for that port.

Jonah almost missed his bus because of fear, selfishness but mostly because of his hatred of the Ninevites.

Jonah had a hard time receiving God's mercy for himself and for the Ninevites.



Most people focus on the Big Fish Story and miss God's incredible mercy.

Jonah's 5 word prayer:

In Forty Days Destruction's Coming



Jonah's shipmates and the Ninevites (including the King) had a greater spiritual transformation than he did.

Right now on a global scale we are seeing the destructive effects of hatred and unforgiveness.

4 Beautiful Lessons from Jonah's Life

- 3. God doesn't just walk among us, He walks among our enemies while praying for them, too.
- 4. God's love and mercy is for ALL.
