- 5. What are some similarities or differences between Christian lament and worldly lament?
- 6. Is it ever wrong for a Christian to lament? Why or why not?
- 7. Are you ever reluctant to voice your complaints or frustration to God in prayer? Why or why not?
- 8. What might it mean if you are a Christian and don't particularly feel a need to lament your status as an exile in this world?
- 9. What does it mean that those who sow in tears shall reap in joy (Ps. 126:5)? Why is this an important promise for believers?
- 10. How does the cross of Christ become the ultimate anchor and resolution for our suffering, pain, or frustration while living in the midst of exile?
