Questions for Reflection and Discussion

Genesis 1:3-25

- 1. There has long been debate and disagreement among sincere Christians regarding some of the details found in the Genesis 1 creation account. Given that, what are specific aspects of Genesis 1 that, in your opinion, represent non-negotiable convictions or beliefs about which all Christians should agree? And how do you feel that Christians should approach differences in opinion about these matters?
- 2. Do you think our culture, by and large, is more interested in finding out the particular *method(s)* God used to create the universe (the how) or in the *meaning* behind the creation (the why)? Which do you personally feel should be more important? Which do you feel the original author(s) of Genesis 1 were more interested in exploring?
- 3. What do you observe about the outline of vv. 3-25 (how the writer(s) specifically described each day of creation)? What patterns do you notice? What do these patterns teach us about God's beauty, unity, and order?
- 4. In what ways do these verses in Genesis stand in stark contrast to atheism? To polytheism? To pantheism? To humanism?
- 5. What do Psalm 19:1-6 and Romans 1:18-20 reveal to us about the role creation plays in pointing us back to the Creator?
- 6. What are some specific ways that God uses nature to speak to you or to reveal Himself to you?
- 7. What are some different ways that we can either exploit nature or worship created things rather than the Creator? What is dangerous about either of these things?
- 8. What does it mean that God looked at His creation and "saw that it was good"? In what ways is creation "good"?
