## **Questions for Reflection and Discussion**

Genesis 16:1-13

- 1. Why was Hagar such an unlikely candidate (at least from a human standpoint) to have a close encounter with God?
- 2. In what ways does Genesis 16 illustrate the struggle we all face to trust God, particularly in desperate moments?
- 3. The angel of the Lord initiated the conversation with Hagar in v. 8 by asking her a couple of questions. Why does God sometimes do that in Scripture (e.g, with Adam in the Garden), if He is omniscient and already knows everything?
- 4. What might be the significance of the angel of the Lord appearing to Hagar in this chapter rather than to Abram or Sarai?
- 5. What does it mean, practically speaking, to be "seen" by God? What did it mean for Hagar? What implications does it have for our lives?
- 6. In v. 11, the angel says to Hagar, "The Lord has heard *your affliction."* (Note that it doesn't say "heard *of* your affliction" or "heard *about* your affliction" in the original Hebrew.) Why might this detail be significant?
- 7. Have you ever had a circumstance like Hagar in which you had a close encounter with God during a challenging season of your life? What did that experience teach you about God? What did it teach you about yourself?
