<sup>20</sup> Then he began to denounce the cities where most of his mighty works had been done, because they did not repent.

<sup>21</sup> "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida!
For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes.

<sup>22</sup> But I tell you, it will be more bearable on the day of judgment for Tyre and Sidon than for you.

## Matthew 11:20-30 <sup>23</sup> And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? You will be brought down to Hades.

For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Sodom, it would have remained until this day.

<sup>24</sup> But I tell you that it will be more tolerable on the day of judgment for the land of Sodom than for you."

<sup>25</sup> At that time Jesus declared, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that you have hidden these things from the wise and understanding and revealed them to little children;

## Matthew 11:20-30 <sup>26</sup> yes, Father, for such was your gracious will.

<sup>27</sup> All things have been handed over to me by my Father, and no one knows the Son except the Father,

## Matthew 11:20-30 and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

## Matthew 11:20-30 <sup>28</sup> Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.

<sup>29</sup> Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.

## Matthew 11:20-30 <sup>30</sup> For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."
