Questions for Reflection and Discussion

Romans 11:17-24

1. Paul's first warning in this passage is against becoming arrogant toward the "branches." What are some examples of us missing this warning historically? In what ways are we as modern believers still missing this warning?
2. Paul tells us not to become proud, but instead to fear God (v.20). What does a healthy fear of God look like in your life?
3. Paul tells us to note both the **kindness** and **severity** of God (v. 22). How is God severe? What is God's kindness?
4. Do you find yourself gravitating more toward God's **kindness** or **severity**? What are some of the spiritual pitfalls of only focusing on one? What would it look like in your life to hold both of these in tension?
5. The Israelites believed in God, believed in God's promises, and yet they were "broken off because of their unbelief" (v.19). In what ways was their belief misplaced?
6. In what ways can we think we "believe" but still fall into the trap of "unbelief" today?
7. Read Romans 9:1-5 and 10:1. Why does Paul say he has "*great sorrow and unceasing anguish*?" How should this shape how we interact and think about unbelievers in our lives?
